The Black Caucus of the American Library Association invites BCALA members to apply for positions on BCALA's standing committees. The committees sponsor programs, perform research, and conduct much of the organization's business. Newer members are especially encouraged to consider committee service as a way to become involved in the organization.

- Affiliates Committee:** Serves as a liaison between affiliated member organizations.
- ALA Relations Committee:** Keeps abreast of ALA Council and Divisional activities and local, state, national and international legislation as they relate to BCALA.
- Awards Committee:** Solicits nominations, selects the recipients and presents the awards. A subcommittee of the Awards Committee shall present the John C. Tyson Award.
- Budget/finance Committee:** Monitors fiscal affairs of the BCALA.
- Constitution & Bylaws Committee:** Reviews and recommends needed changes of the Constitution and Bylaws.
- Dr. E.J. Josey Scholarship Committee:** Recognizes the efforts of Dr. E.J. Josey, the founder of the Black Caucus of the ALA, Inc. This monetary award is given annually to a Library Science student of color.
- Fundraising Committee:** Coordinates and engages in fundraising activity to support the programs and activities of BCALA.
- History Committee:** Encourages research, preservation, and publication of African American library history.
- International Relations Committee:** Develops programs, exchanges information, advocates, and promotes understanding and awareness of International concerns and services as it relates to the African Diaspora.
- Literacy Awards Committee:** Recognizes and celebrates black authors and black literature according to established criteria.

- Marketing and Public Relations Committee:** Provides visibility, a voice and view point of BCALA in print and social media.
- Membership Committee:** Develops and coordinates membership promotion and keeps records of membership status.
- Nomination & Elections Committee:** Solicits nominations for office, prepares, receives ballots, and reports results of elections.
- Program Committee:** Plans, initiates, recommends and coordinates programs for membership that will promote the goals and vision of BCALA.
- Publications:** Assists and coordinates the production of the BCALA News Newsletter.
- Recruitment & Professional Development Committee:** Promotes and develops recruiting strategies, provides professional development training and mentoring /coaching opportunities for African Americans into the field of librarianship.
